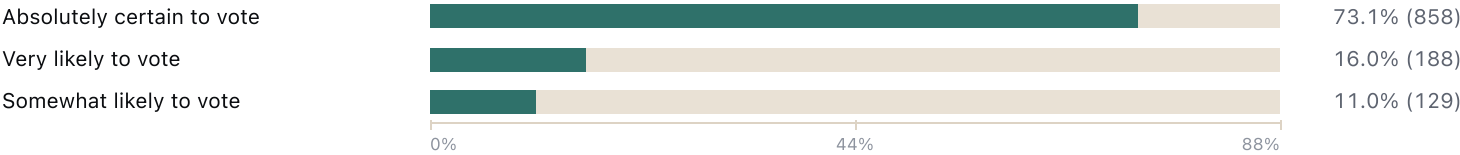
Likely-voter screen

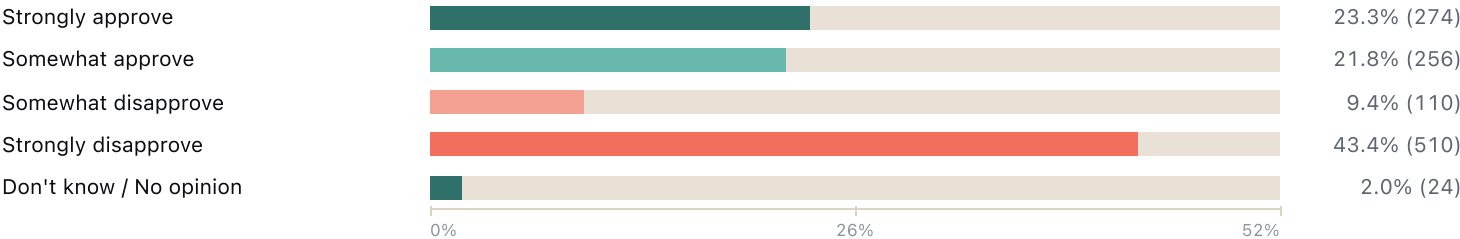
Approval and image

How would you rate the overall job performance of President Donald Trump?

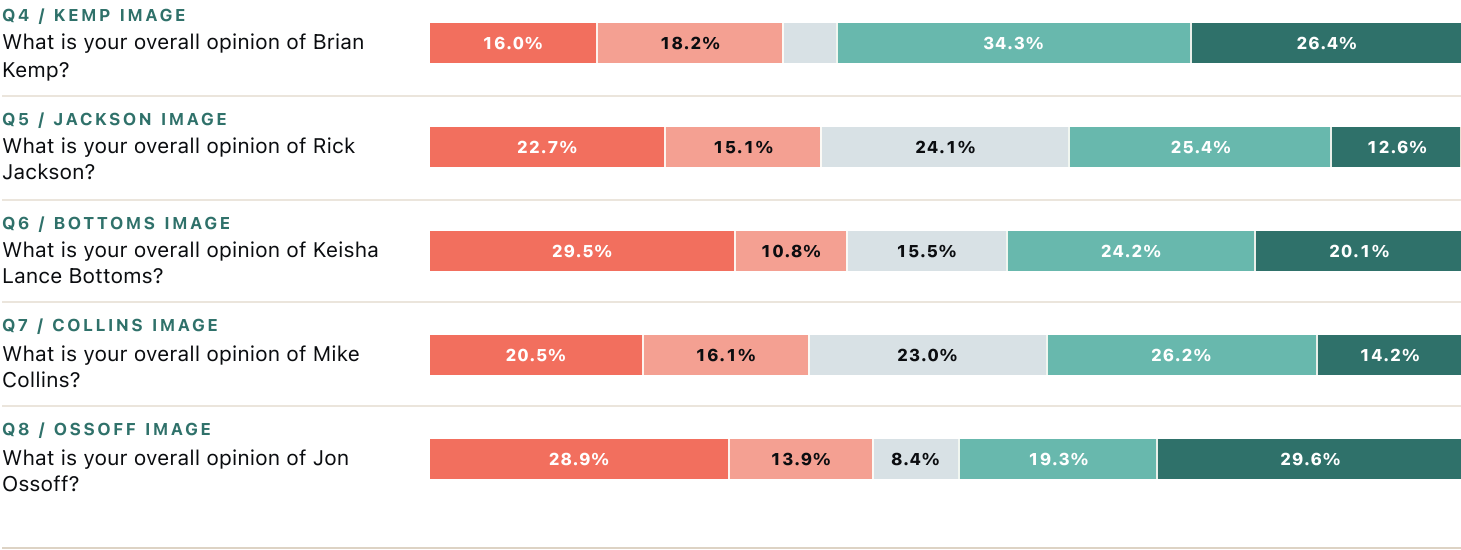

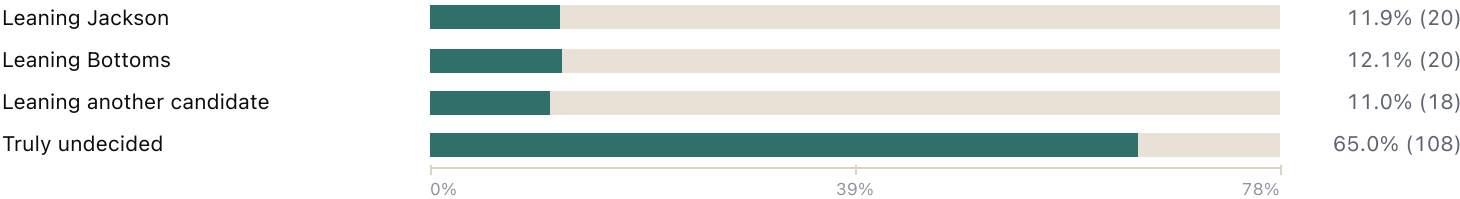
If the election for Georgia Governor were held today, who would you vote for?

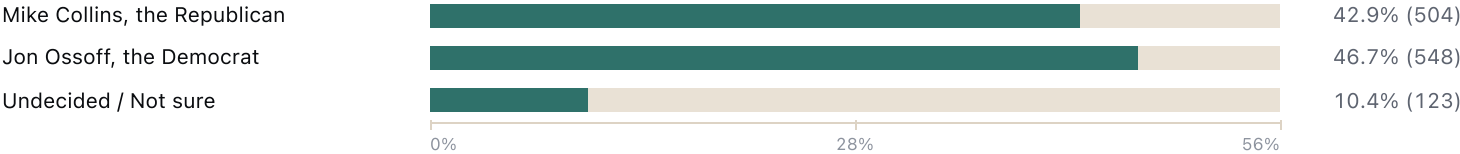
If undecided, which candidate are you leaning toward?

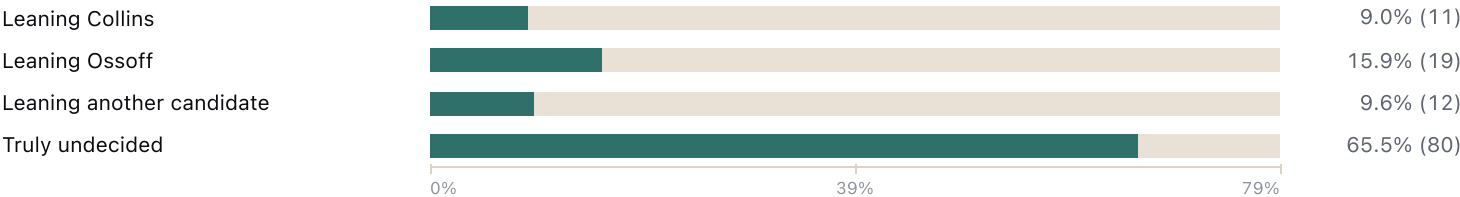
If the election for the U.S. Senate were held today, who would you vote for?

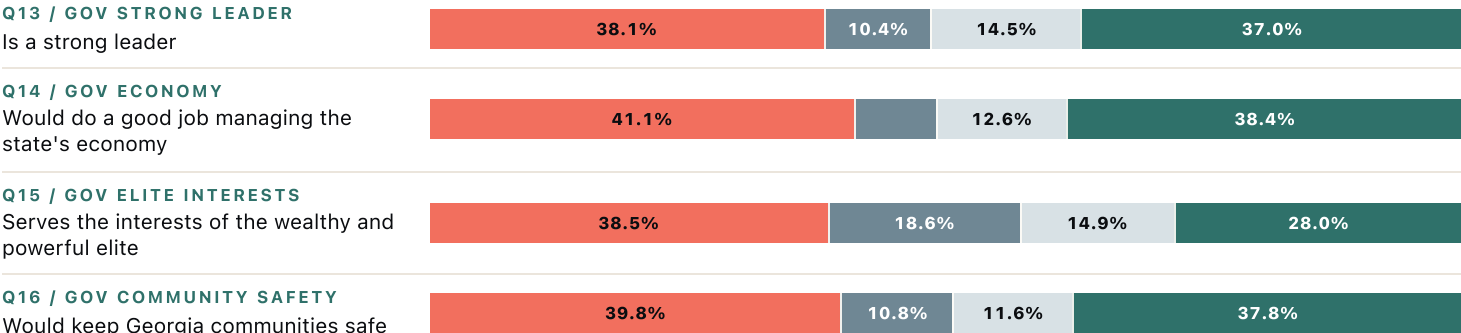
Governor traits

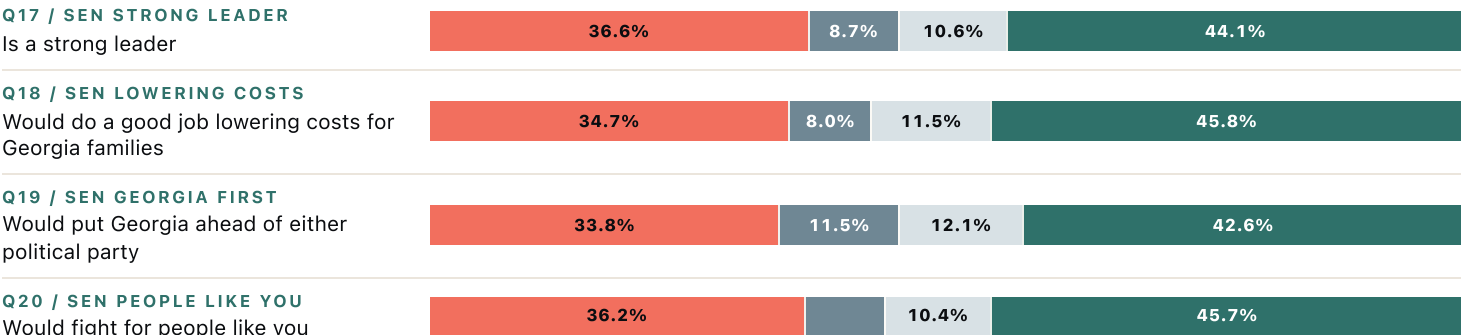
Senate traits

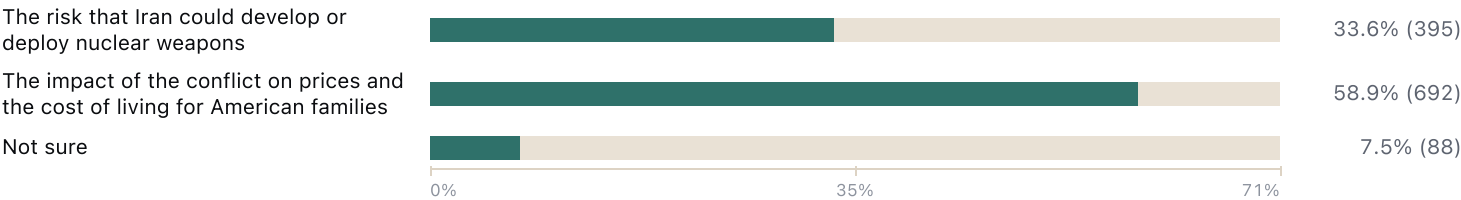
Issue environment

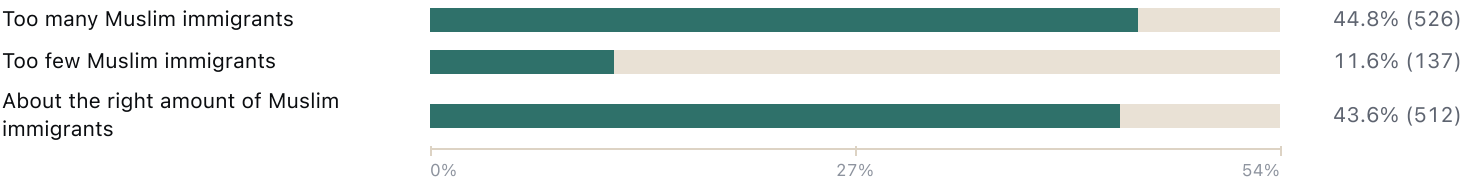
In regards to the conflict with Iran, which concern weighs more heavily on you personally?

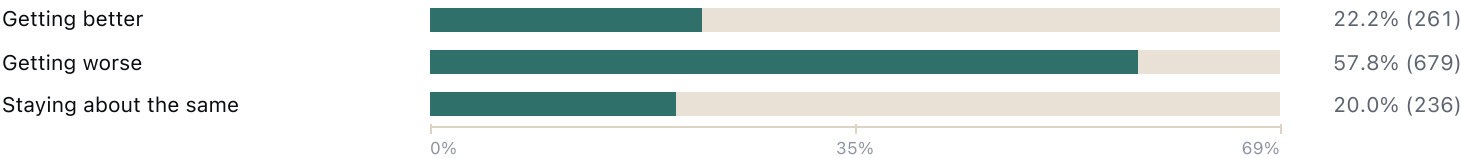
